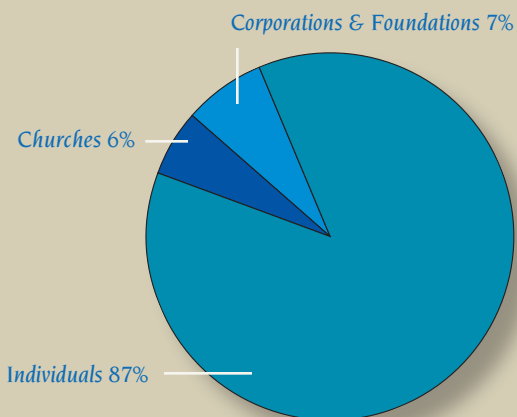


You are our most important asset.

Women and Families Program

Lydia House provides hope and help for the South Bay's rapidly growing number of homeless single women and mothers with children. Whether they are seeking shelter because of abuse, addiction, or financial problems, women and children find the physical, emotional and spiritual support they need each year in our safe, family-oriented housing and our New Life Program.

Chapel

Every evening at 7 pm and every Sunday morning at 10:30 am, Long Beach Rescue Mission invites our guests and members of the community to join us for worship. Several churches in the South Bay are involved in this community outreach program, joining us at the Mission to conduct services and help serve meals.

Learning Center

To help men and women become self-sufficient, the Mission offers a variety of programs and services including those in our Learning Center. The NOVA computer education program provides opportunities to learn computer skills as well as help for those who need to get their high school diplomas and gain better job skills. All New Life Program participants spend up to 10 hours a week working on their education and job skills.

Long Beach prides itself on being the most diverse city in the nation. People from all walks of life live together in the South Bay. As neighbors, we work to meet the needs of everyone who needs a hand up to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness.

Emergency Services

Food – More than 105,000 meals are provided each year for hungry men, women and children.

Shelter – The homeless live in constant fear of being robbed, beaten or even killed. Our shelter beds are full nearly every night.

Clothing – Clothing is provided free of charge to those who need it.

Hygiene – Our guests receive hot showers every day and can also take personal hygiene supplies with them.

Counseling & Care – Our staff helps guests with everything from personal issues to finding the resources they need to get back on their feet.

Men's Program

At Samaritan House, more than 120 men are receiving mission services on any given day. Our New Life Program provides the education and spiritual training individuals need to overcome the addictions that hold them in bondage, build a lasting relationship with Jesus Christ and return to their homes, families and communities.
